PUT IT DOWN FOR GOD'S SAKE

I'm so pleased for the comments so far made concerning the interactive projector that was unveiled last week for our use. 99% have expressed their gratitude, that it will enable us to pray and to praise God in unison. Two parishioners have complained about it, observing that the presence of the screen and projector in the Church, is a sure disrespect to the Blessed Sacrament! Their concerns need to be listened to and taken into consideration.

The critics of the new development suffer no disability either of sight or of hearing. The projector is certainly irrelevant, since their senses are sound. However we have parishioners who have expressed deep gratitude that at last they can follow the Mass. These include those who especially are close to my heart. Human beings are not perfect machines; as time goes by, our senses start to wear and tear. While someone might still have good eyesight, he might start to suffer from poor hearing, or while he might have good hearing, the sight might not be that good. How do we respond to such conditions? It goes without saying that, as your priest, I feel concerned with those worshippers who are handicaped in one way or the other, it is the duty of everyone to put them at the centre of our community.

There is another reason why the interactive projector becomes necessary. For the last two year, I have with gratitude thanked parents who come with children to Sunday Mass. How can those children follow the Mass or pray with us without some visual facility being put in place? Thanks to our teachers that all our children know how to read, we can use that ability as a starting point by installing a projector, where words and hymns for the Mass can be projected. Parents need to bring them forward where they can see the screen.

School Mass is another reason that demanded for an interactive projector to be installed. For the parishioners who attend school Masses, they must have noticed that children participation is not vigorous. Does it mean that children do not like to pray? By no means, the problem is that at their stage, they have not mastered the prayers of Mass and the church has not provided the means to achieve it. How will they know the faith if they lack ways of interiorizing it! With the prayers of Mass on the screen, all you need as a parent, guardian or teacher is to ask the child to put his/her hands together and slowly say the words projected.

As a parish, we need to examine our contribution to environmental degradation on the countries where the papers we use come from. To understand this, you need to stand in the shoes of the people who suffer global environmental change which scientists attribute to human activity. As a parish what are we doing to change our contribution to global environmental disasters? The parish has the duty to move forward by humanely responding to the challenges affecting our planet.

I thank you for constantly responding with generosity to the appeals made by CAFOD and other Charities. I ask you to consider the installed projector as a practical positive response to overcome environment degradation that cause people to abandon their homes in search of safer places. We hope to buy some Mass books in the near future, however I invite you to see the hidden values of having a projector shared by so many people to achieve the same results
