WE DO NOT COME TO PRAY AS INDIVIDUALS BUT AS A FAMILY

I wish you all a blessed Easter and I thank you for your fidelity to Christ. This newsletter will serve us for **TWO Weekends** the next one will be on 3rd May

The crucifixion, death and resurrection of Jesus was the first thing that all who lived in the vast Roman empire first heard from the people who spoke to them about Jesus of Nazareth. The parenthood of Jesus or his infancy, was not of interest. There is not a single word in the Bible which is attributed to his foster father Joseph. For the early Christians, the early life of Jesus was not the central part of the Good News.

As we know, the disciples on the road to Emmaus, having been joined by a knowledgeable yet ignorant traveller, did not speak to him about where Jesus was born or the kind of parentage that had raised him up, instead they told him about his teaching which had raised their hopes. That hope was dimmed by his arrest, his agony on the cross and by his quick un ceremonial burial. Three days had gone by!

The events of Good Friday, agonizing as they were, became the reason to recognise the love of God for the world through Christ. It was the motivating factor to preach him throughout the world. The first Christians were not silent but obstinate 'gossipers' about Jesus to the pagan world.

The Easter we celebrate takes place during the Jubilee year 2025. It comes at a time when we are also establishing our Parish Pastoral Council in response to the directives of our Archbishop. We are pilgrims of hope. Easter is a time to rediscover ourselves as followers of Christ and our duty to witness to him sometimes in a hostile environment. This is what the early Christians did.

The other day, I was reflecting on the lives of our parishioners who have died in the past months. I can assure you that they were faithful runners who firmly held the baton of faith in their hand, they have handed it over to us, it is in our hands. Those who have died are no longer pilgrims of hope but we are. As a parish, let us set into social action by opening our faith to one another, welcoming each other and by getting involved into practical work.

Our predecessors built us the Parish hall with the intention of sharing some life experiences outside Holy Mass through some conversation. Tea and coffee are served to everyone after Mass, as the hall is not open for a selected few but to everyone. Let us enjoy the presence of one another as fellow pilgrims of hope.

It is so nice to see children playing and running about chasing each other in the hall while the parents engage in conversations or have a cup of coffee. As children do so, they learn practical skills how to relate with other people. They cannot acquire them by watching the television. Therefore spend some time back for the good of your child.
