BISHOP TIMOTHY MENEZES REFLECTION ON THE DEATH OF POPE FRANCIS

Soon after celebrating our Easter morning Masses, we saw the courage of Pope Francis in taking his usual place on the balcony of St Peter's Basilica in Rome on this day to greet the City of Rome and the World. His breathing and his speech appeared so laboured, but he greeted us with the words: Dear brothers and sisters: Happy Easter! And he gave the world his blessing. Little did we know that this would be his last. Even in his frail state on Easter Day, Pope Francis recognised the desire of the people to see the Holy Father and he travelled around St Peter's Square blessing the people and some young children.

Only days before, on Holy Thursday, again defying the odds and insistent on keeping an annual appointment that he established during his papacy - the Mass of the Lord's Supper surrounded by prison inmates - who were so delighted to welcome him. The relative shock of the timing of Pope Francis' death, despite his recent period of serious illness and evident decline, reminds us all that the timing of our return 'to the House of the Father' is not a time of our choosing but as and when the giver of the gift calls us back into his loving embrace.

When faced with the death of a Pope during the Octave of Easter Day, which the Church asks us to keep with the same joy as Easter Day, how should we respond in terms of Masses and liturgical celebrations? Actually, our faith informs us: that the Easter Octave is a highpoint of the year which continues, and what better way could there be to commend somebody to the love and mercy of God than in the light of the Resurrection?

As we reflect on the many aspects of Pope Francis' almost 12 years as the successor of St Peter, we acknowledge his focus on the Joy of the Gospel, on Care for Creation, on the dignity of human person, on the Church being a prophetic voice at the service of the world, on the importance of young people as the 'now' of the Church and as a compassionate voice for refugees, we can call to mind that most evocative image of his solitary figure standing in a rain-soaked St Peter's Square at the height of the first Covid-19 lockdown, 27th March 2020, blessing the frightened world.

Later in 2020, he urged us to see the pandemic as a moment in time to look at the world differently, overcoming division and seeking unity:

All too quickly, however, we forget the lessons of history, "the teacher of life". Once this health crisis passes, our worst response would be to plunge even more deeply into feverish consumerism and new forms of egotistic self-preservation. God willing, after all this, we will think no longer in terms of "them" and "those", but only "us". If only this may prove not to be just another tragedy of history from which we learned nothing. (Fratelli Tutti 35)

As the Church marks the Second Sunday of Eastertide, appropriately in respect of Pope Francis - Divine Mercy Sunday - and the same weekend in the Church's calendar that St John Paul II died, 20 years ago, we pray: May Pope Francis, Jorge Bergoglio, rest in peace and awaken to his resurrection on the Last Day. Amen. Alleluia!
