# WE SHOULD EXPECT SOME CHANGES

John XXIII was elected as successor to Peter on 28th October 1958 on the fourth ballot in the 1958 papal conclave. He was 76 years old. It is said that the Cardinals were not prepared for a conclave following the death of Pope Pius XII, therefore they elected an old man who would not live long as pope, while in the meantime, they would be preparing a conclave that would choose a younger pope to lead the Church for a long time. To their surprise, the old man noticed that the Church was antiquated, time has changed, the language of the world had changed, so he called a Second Vatican Council to make changes that would enable the Church to live in the changing world. He guided the Church for 5 years to the surprise of many.

The Catholic Church is the oldest organised institution on planet earth with a historical span of over 2000 years. The secret of its survival is in its ability to evolve and to adapt to changing times and situations while maintaining its core teaching, traditions and discipline. There is not any other institution that has successfully done so for such a long time.

You must be fully aware that the Archbishop of Birmingham is trying to make changes in his diocese to respond to the falling numbers of vocations, the falling numbers of Catholics that attend Mass, and reducing number of clergy in active ministry caused by sickness and old age. Some of us might be shocked to see churches closing or amalgamating or to learn that a traditional Mass time is being scrapped. What should we do as practicing Christians? To answer this question, we need to look back into Christian history and ask: what did our predecessors do when they were faced with difficulties that required them to make a choice?

Christians throughout history lived in expectation of change to take place at any time, this made them to be adaptive and being adaptive brought about resilience. The boundaries of our parish have changed but the boots on the ground have remained the same! As missionary priests serving you the people of God within this area, Fr. Pius and I, will do our best. We ask you to understand the situation in which we are as a Church, which might certainly require adjustments or total change of direction. Change can throw us out of balance, but like St. Paul nothing can separate us from the love of God, neither physical hardships nor spiritual powers (Rom 8:35-39).
