IF YOU HAVE NO CROSS IN YOUR LIFE RE EXAMINE YOUR LOVE

I was born and brought up in a family with two older sisters and three young sisters. As we grew in size, the family house seemed to be filled with girls. It did not take long before teenage caught up with us, sometimes the five sisters would not avoid resisting the temptation to think that maybe, their brother was passing on some information to mum! This brought about some unease between siblings, since the only boy in the house was always under suspicion! When you have a minority voice, things are less likely to go your way, the majority wins! This can become truly challenging when with the pretext of majority voice being winner, someone has to sacrifice something which others may not recognise as important.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. Christians the world over, celebrate this event, but only a tiny few will reflect on the existence of a cross (not many crosses) in their own lives. The Cross was the chosen manifestation of Jesus Christ himself to show his love for mankind. He spoke to Nicodemus "just as Moses raised the serpent in the desert, so must the son of man be raised up." The same Jesus with his cross walking ahead of us turns and says "If any one of you wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself, take up his cross everyday and follow me..." Lk. 9:23, Matt. 16:24, and Mk 8:34. It signifies that to be a true disciple, one must deny themselves, prioritize God's will over their own desires, and be willing to endure hardships and sacrifices, even suffering, for the sake of Christ and His teachings. It is a call to total commitment and a radical reorientation of one's life to follow Jesus' example. This brings to us the undeniable fact that for every follower of Christ, there is a cross to carry before we qualify. In addition you discover that you have nothing to suffer for or to suffer with, then you are not yet a disciple of Christ.

Jesus loves us truly, we should remember always that true love is costly but in a beautiful way. It isn't about financial expenses but about the sacrifices you make for the good of the people you care about. Who among us has not seen parents wake up in the middle of the night to see what has happened to the child who wakes up suddenly frightened! Is there any true parent who does not work so hard to put food on the table and a roof over his/her children's heads and to make sure that they are safe? Yet in order to fulfil these parental obligations they have to put aside their personal comfort. Loving someone involves investing emotional energy, accepting to become vulnerable and risking hurt.

True love is the only one which breaks one's heart; it requires making sacrifice, big or small. You cannot love someone without making a sacrifice of your personal time, adjusting your priorities or putting someone else's needs before your own. This is exactly what Jesus did: "for though he was in the form of God, he did not count equality with God, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in the human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death, death on the Cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him..." Phil. 2:6-9.

I wish you all a festive Sunday of the triumph of the Cross of Christ in our personal lives if we take it up for love of him and follow him. If you have no cross, re-examine your love.
