TO ACT WITH US AS A WITNESS TO HIS RESURRECTION:

If you are a practicing Catholic, the first reading read last Wednesday concerning the circumstances and criterion that was used by the Apostles to elect Mathias to succeed Judas Iscariot, the man who betrayed Jesus, was not a surprise. Simon Peter, head of the college of the Apostles set the crondition:

"We must therefore choose someone who has been with us the whole time that the Lord Jesus was travelling round with us, someone who was with us right from the time when John was baptising until the day when he was taken up from us—and he can act with us as a witness to his resurrection" (Acts 1:21-22).

The underlined words had paramount influence on the nomination and on the vote. The choice was between two men, both good and true, both believers in Jesus, and both were witnesses of his resurrection. It is important to note here, that from earliest times, the Church has had plenty of candidates to choose from! The candidate had to have been consistent, dependable and willing to witness to Jesus at any cost, not someone who followed him when it served him.

Reflecting on this, I felt the need to re-evaluate my personal consistence in being a Christian and how much score I would make if Peter was to present another need to replace Judas. Could I pass the score? I admire parishioners who speak to me about their membership in this parish. Some of them, have their memory go back in their childhood. Their enduring membership in the parish, has created resilience to the ups - and - downs of the parish. This is a sure sign of their fidelity

The Apostle Mathias had a singular duty to be a living witness to the resurrection of Jesus, which is actually the very duty that every baptised receives on the day of baptism. We are witnesses to the resurrection. St. Paul affirmed the fact of resurrection:

"if there is no resurrection of the dead, Christ himself cannot have been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is useless and your believing it is useless; indeed we are shown up as witnesses who have committed perjury before God. For if the dead are not raised, Christ has not been raised and if Christ has not been raised, you are still in your sins. What is more serious, all who have died in Christ have perished. If our hope in Christ has been for this life only, we are the most unfortunate of all people" (1Cor. 15: 13-19).

We are nearing the Solemnity of Pentecost, let us renew our baptismal commitment by bringing into our life the reason for our becoming Christians namely to be witnesses of his resurrection. To be a credible witness requires constancy, fidelity, community spirit, unwavering hope and endurance in difficult times. Then, a person who behaves in this manner "can act with us as a witness to his resurrection" (Acts 1:22).
