"SO YOU ARE A KING THEN'-YES I'M A KING" Jn 18:37

It seemed to be the biggest joke that the Roman governor Pontius Pilate ever encountered. A man stood there in front of him bruised with marks on his body which indicated that he had been badly tortured, he was covered in blood. Before his arrest, the man had been smartly dressed, after all he was celebrating the Passover. However, for the moment, the festive cloths were torn and bore marks of dirt because of the many falls after his arrest. His left eye was badly injured, he could hardly speak. The men who dragged him before the hated Roman governor were his countrymen. They could not enter the infamous compound for fear of becoming unclean. The man before the governor was a renowned preacher from Nazareth in Galilee

Pilate took interest to know whether the accusations laid against the man calling himself a king would be of any threat to the Roman rule over the Province of Judaea as it was known: He questioned him "are you the king of the Jews (Jn 18:33)? The response of Jesus "yes I'm a king" frightened Pontius Pilate - the governor, but calmed him when he added "but my kingdom is not of this world" (Jn. 18:36). There is no doubt that Pilate viewed Jesus as a harmless deluded man by no means a threat to the Roman rule. The inscription on the cross INRI (Iesus Nazarethi Rex Iudaeorum) written by Pilate meaning 'Jesus of Nazareth the King of the Jews', was meant to be a mockery, rather than an acknowledgement of Jesus' kingship.

The solemnity of Christ the King is an acknowledgement and a confession that indeed Jesus is the Universal ruler and saviour of all mankind, but his kingdom is not of this world. It is a spiritual realm not a physical territory bound by geographical or political boarders. It is a kingdom where:

The last are first (Matt. 20:26-28)

The Poor are blessed (Lk. 6:20)

Enemies are loved (Matt. 5:44).

Forgiveness is unconditional (Matthew 18:35)

The throne from which Jesus rules the hearts of the people of the world is the cross. He has given each one of us a tiny bit of it to carry it and follow him. Our universal call on him is: "Lord remember me when you come into your kingdom" Luke 23:42.

Diocesan News and Communication Our Catholic Faith

When people think of the Catholic faith, or the Catholic Church, some combination of her beliefs, her history, her architecture, her art, her charity, her saints or sinners, often come to mind. However, the Church's deepest identity is to be found in her founder, Jesus Christ, and her faithfulness to Him.

The Church, or the Body of Christ, is the communion of those whom God is saving: through Christ's life, death on the cross and resurrection from the dead, He calls mankind to repentance and to enter into eternal (or Divine) life, purely out of love for them.

Faith is the gift that God gives to those who trust Him and welcome His Grace, particularly through the sacrament of Baptism. The Holy Spirit comes to dwell in every Christian, making them an adopted child of God, and in order to produce those good fruits which manifest His love and the signs of His Kingdom in the world.

There is no-one from whom this invitation is withheld: "the invisible God, from the fullness of his love, addresses men as his friends, and moves among them, in order to invite and receive them into his own company".

Our Faith, therefore, is a response to this great love of God which unites us to Christ, under the Pope and the Bishops whom He appointed to lead the Church, and which compels us to live out our unique vocation, or calling.

Come Back to the Church

If you are here for the first time, or it is a long time you were at Church, you are very welcome. Our Parish community welcomes all people to come and visit or worship with us. You needn't be a baptised Catholic to walk through the doors of our Church or to stay and pray during Mass. We are very happy that you are here with us.

If you are interested in becoming a Catholic or finding out more about the Catholic faith then speak to your parish priest. There is a period of instruction prior to being received into the Church that people go through so that they may better understand Catholic beliefs and why we do the things that we do. This is called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults or is more commonly known as RCIA. This is offered every Tuesday in the parish hall of Our Lady's starting 7:30pm and St Anne's Parish Hall starting at 5:00pm. If you are already a Catholic, but have been away from the Church for any amount of time, please know that you are most welcome to return. You may wish to speak to your parish priest about Confession. Be assured that it is always a great source of joy when someone returns to the Church after being away from the faith. The priest will be very understanding if you are returning and let him know how long it has been since your last Confession, he will be happy to guide you through the process.
