THE LITURGICAL YEAR OF THE CHURCH

It is the Solemnity of Christ the King, the last Sunday together to conclude the liturgical year of the Church before we start a new one. I thank you all for being faithful disciples of Christ. Our Lord Jesus Christ was rightly addressed by the people as Rabuni a Hebrew word that means teacher. However, apart from him being found by his parents in the temple, seated among doctors of the Law, listening to them and asking them questions, Jesus is not known to have attended any known Rabbinic schools. How then could he have merited the title?

The Church looks at Jesus as her teacher; she has drawn a syllabus that embody his teaching, a teaching that is passed on to those who believe. The Liturgical Year unfolds the mystery of Christ through reading or listening to the Sacred Scripture, in liturgy and worship. This in turn forms our liturgical Syllabus.

When we think about a calendar year, we think of it in terms of its seasons. Each season has its particular feel, its own customs and activities that it is associated with. We adapt or change according to the season. We wear different clothes, play different sports, and eat different foods. We even associate colours with different seasons. The Liturgical Year is similar, in the way it is organised. It provides particular seasons with occasions and feasts to ritualize the significant movements in our Christian life. It is through this cyclical process that the Church renews herself again and again.

Christian life is a journey that can be viewed using the image of seasons. Each season has its own feasts, its own symbols and colour. All these help us to explore and be involved in the mystery of Jesus Christ, his incarnation, birth, public life, his death and resurrection from the dead. Through them we experience seasons in the physical, social, emotional and spiritual aspects of our lives.

The Liturgical Year starts with the first Sunday of Advent and concludes on the Sunday of the Solemnity of Christ the King which we celebrate today. What a Liturgical Year celebrates is Jesus Christ; however, we look at this same mystery, from different aspects such that we learn something new each time we encounter him. Year after year the mystery of Christ invites us to deepen our relationship with him.

We begin this New Liturgical Year by using the new Lectionary donated to the parish posthumously by the Late Mr. Hugh Thomas McAteer, who served this parish in so many ways. I'm so grateful to his wife Anne McAteer for fulfilling his wishes. It is worth mentioning that the big book on the Altar (the Missal) was donated by Ashley and Brothers families in memory of the departed members of the Wisniewski family.

I thank all the people of this parish for your generosity towards the Church which has made this a worthy place of worship. I thank you also for your fidelity to Christ throughout the liturgical year and for carrying out your ministries. It is the Spirit of God himself who is working through you, building his Kingdom.
