Come Lord Jesus

To celebrate and renew the life of Jesus Christ throughout the year, to provide a continuous structure for worship and spiritual reflection, the Church goes through a cycle of Liturgical Years. As the liturgical year cycles through seasons of the birth, death, and resurrection of our Savior, the emphasis is on the importance of preparing for His return by renewing our faith. These cycles encourage spiritual journey of continuous preparation, as well as an assurance that the mysteries of Christ are made present to every generation.

The liturgical calendar separates Church calendar from the secular calendar, to offer a healthy balance that contrasts with the monotony of the secular year. The seasons of Lent, Easter, Christmas and all other celebrations and the feasts of saints, the memorials, and the solemnities all have their genesis in Advent but none is complete without the other (Rom. 8:22-25). Each separate cycle builds on and compliments the other season and so are the seasons of our life: the complementarity of gifts and talents, the uniqueness and the differences. The changing of liturgical cycle also calls us to embrace each other and the subsequent differences. No cycle repeats itself and so do we, we are different and yet made one single family by the events we celebrate in the liturgical year, with a common acclamation "Come Lord Jesus" (maran atha).

This acclamation carries the advent meaning; a time for vigilant waiting, spiritual purification, and conversion. It is a period of waiting with 'holy anxiety', a hopeful anticipation of Christ's arrival while lifting our gaze and lightening our hearts (Acts 20:27-310). Our waiting is 'anxiously holy' because we wait with a purpose. As parents of a newborn prepare for the child's birth, so we make our hearts ready for Christ's new birth and our birth into eternal life. In Advent we need to make Him a place to belong, in our hearts and in our lives. In this year's advent, I invite you to work on one element all together "the renewal of our parish community", for each not to just be present but to belong. Just as Jesus came and felt a sense of belonging among the human community, we too may feel that we belong to this family (this Parish). Every parishioner needs to feel the comfort which Jesus was offered, and then we may each offer the comfort that Mary and Joseph offered to the baby Jesus (Lk 2:40-52); every member carrying equal importance as we unanimously cry out "come Lord Jesus"

Our Catholic Faith

The Holy Spirit comes to dwell in every Christian, making them an adopted child of God, and in order to produce those good fruits which manifest His love and the signs of His Kingdom in the world.

There is no-one from whom this invitation is withheld: "the invisible God, from the fullness of his love, addresses men as his friends, and moves among them, in order to invite and receive them into his own company".

Our Faith, therefore, is a response to this great love of God which unites us to Christ, under the Pope and the Bishops whom He appointed to lead the Church, and which compels us to live out our unique vocation, or calling.
