Come Lord Jesus: "The Daily Coming of Christ"

Advent is a time when we prepare for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. During this time, we meditate on the three comings of Jesus and we led by the acclamation "Come Lord Jesus" (maran atha). This is a prayerful cry that attaches Jesus' first coming into human history as savior, the present or daily coming, and the ultimate hope of the future return by focusing on the spiritual reign he has established (Rev. 22:12-20). The first coming was observable when he was born in Bethlehem of Galilee; the last will be glorious when he will come as a judge. But the daily coming is quiet, continuous and personal. Jesus' daily coming is what connects us to the first and future comings.

When Jesus came 2000+ years ago, people expected Him to save them from their present political oppression and they forgot to welcome Him in their daily life. Our preparations for Christmas celebrations should imitate *Mary's Fiat* (response), "*Let it be done to me according to your word*" (Lk. 1:38). When we pray "Come Lord Jesus," we echo her receptive and humble 'Yes' to God's will. Mary's first action was to travel to the hill country of Judea to visit her aunt Elizabeth. Her visit brought joy to both Elizabeth and John the Baptist who was still in the womb. And, Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit.

The Mary and Elizabeth's moment is what we experience in every Liturgy of the Eucharist; and it is what our life as Christians should be to the world. Jesus comes to us daily through the graces of the Holy Spirit, the Sacraments and the proclamation of his word. In this daily coming, Jesus is less visible just like it was in the encounter at the visitation (*Lk.* 1:39-45). In the quiet of our hearts, Christ comes to us in spirit and power, guiding us, healing us, and transforming us. St. Bernard says, this daily coming is a continuous reminder of God's presence and His power to renew us.

We should be able to stir each other's hearts every time we meet. The *maran atha* prayer is an invitation to evangelize next door family, colleagues at work or at the restaurant. These places are our *hill country of Judea*, like Mary we make Christ present to the people we meet leap and filled with joy while actively praying and discerning God's will in daily life; transforming our homes into places of welcome, peace, and spiritual nourishment; where Christian love is bred and tangible to all who enter. By this, everyone becomes a vessel for Christ, carrying His light, love, and presence into the world, just as Mary carried the physical body of Jesus.
