### GIFT AID IS A SURE PART OF OUR SOLUTION:

Each country has its own bad side but there is no country no matter how small or poor, which does not have good side, things to admire or to envy. Writing as someone born from outside the UK, there are three things which I greatly appreciate of this country.

1. That smoking tobacco in public closed places was banned and remains banned.
2. That the NHS serves every person without exception.
3. That the Government supports the people who pay it tax, by giving back to them 0.25% in every pound they donate to their own preferred charity.

As far as I'm concerned these three things are worthy of our admiration

The diocese encourages each parish to find its own means and ways of approach to solving its practical needs. I mentioned to you that, **evangelisation, carbon neutrality and financial resilience** are close to my heart. It is for these reasons that I advocate for the formation of catechists: men, women and young people who wish to share their faith with others. We need to become mindful of our carbon emissions, and resilient when we are faced with difficulties.

Did you know that your generosity enabled our parish to witness a number of weddings last year, that over 100 children and adults received First Holy Communions and Confirmations? Are you aware too that a number of adults were received into full Communion with the Catholic Church after completing their RCIA program? Programs such as these, require expenditures on them, I thank you that you are one of the people who support these causes financially.

Giving your Sunday donations through Gift Aid Scheme (if you are a tax payer), is something I encourage everyone to do; it is easy and it does not cost you more than what you decide to donate. However, it helps the parish to benefit further. If you give your Sunday donation through GA, on every pound you donate, the government adds to your donation £0.25 pence to become £1.25. If you are a taxpayer and register for Gift Aid, when you give your donation say £5.00, the HMRC will add £1.25 so that your donation becomes £6.25 without you paying anything extra. If you pay UK income tax you are able to sign up for Gift Aid.

Imagine more parishioners signed up for Gift Aid, we would raise thousands of pounds more to support our parish. It allows the parish to receive that extra 25p for every pound you donate. For us this makes a big difference, as it becomes a certain path to the parish finance resilience.

We are so blessed that many parishioners have work and faithfully pay tax on their income, do not let the government get what otherwise it gives back to you.

Novena for Christian Unity starts on Sunday 18th January and concludes 24th January.

## Pay Some Attention to this:

### OUR PARISH, OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Dear Brothers and sisters, last week I shared with you the three ambitions that I asked of you to implement this year :Evangelisation and mission, Carbon Neutrality and Resilience. I mentioned that the expansion of the boundaries if our parish require that we take a radical view of becoming evangelisers. Carbon neutrality requires us to re-examine our contribution to climate change which is destroying the planet. Resilience calls on us to do our best to be financially capable of meeting those inevitable expenses to keep the parish. Thank you all for the planned giving which is linked to a number of charities.

I have great admiration for people who have great affection for our church building and its surrounding grounds. A few have expressed their requests to have their ashes interred in our parish cemetery. This emphasises the need to maintain in good order our church building and its grounds. Apart from keeping our church safe, neat and tidy in appearance, there are other important reasons that not only make church maintenance worthwhile but excellent value for money and for planet.

As a parish, our carbon footprint is not good. Through regular maintenance, we are able to conserve what has been passed into our care. Yes, we cannot stop decay, but we can slow it down. We are able to minimise the risk of extensive high cost repairs through regular cleaning of gutters, drains, church boilers and radiators. Doing so is cheaper than having to replace something like the roof following years of neglect..

A church well-looked after means that we do not have to worry about mould growing in the narthex or water dripping through the roof during Mass. Regular statutory inspection of church buildings and trees, helps us to safeguard us and our visitors Our church is beautiful, it enhances the quality of life of its members and it enriches our worship. To put it mildly, our church is cherished. We look after this church not only for us, but for our children and their children. We want them to inherit from us this beautiful, humble place of worship, prayer, petition and praise.

Over the coming years, I foresee that a good amount of money will be spent on regular and necessary maintenance of the church, the presbytery and the parish hall. To reduce our carbon emissions and to contribute to a healthier environment for our children and for their children, we shall need not only good boilers but also benefit from the greener energy by installing solar panels to reduce our dependence on fossil fuels to keep our church warm.

In the meantime, I wish to ask you to cultivate a habit of saving on our parish expenses. When the door is left open during this cold spell, heat is lost, to build it again, we have to keep the boilers running, and when the boilers keep running, the more we have to pay for doing so. Take charge by avoiding unneces-
