THE SECRETS OF THE KINGDOM ARE REVEALED TO YOU

If we were to know who we are as Christians, our life would be very different; but because we are not, life seems to be full of crosses, difficult and full of complaints. We tend to blame the other, instead of making effort to improve ourselves thinking that our destiny is fixed. The gospel of the parable of the Sower reminds us that we are designed by God to become winners and to yield fruits one hundred-fold.

We have often heard people speak about self-awareness. In my culture boys are reminded to behave as boys who are growing into men and girls are constantly reminded to conduct themselves as women who will turn out to become mothers. Parents who devote their lives to train their children to be aware of who they are, despite the resentment that might happen, end up having children that bring them happiness in their old age. Self-awareness is not self-obsession but the ability to be aware of how your thoughts, motives, words, actions blind spots make impact on others.

We should not be upset when people criticise what we do; that becomes a proof that something is happening. There are things which are not expected of a catholic. A practicing Catholic using bad language along the street and a non-baptised doing the same, do not make the same impact on the listeners. To one, it is almost expected, to the other, it should not happen at all! This is what Jesus means when he tells his twelve apostles that "*the secrets of the kingdom of heaven are revealed to you*" in other words-you are different.

Self-awareness without pity turns into self-absorption and embarrassment. I'm sure most of us are aware of the slogan '*Make America Great Again*'. This is an excellent idea, but if in bid to achieve it a man can use the power invested in his office to interfere into Fifa's decision at the World Cup, how on earth can anyone believe that those who lift trophies do so fairly and honestly!

The privileged position of Christians in the world should not be taken for granted, God has revealed the secrets of his love in Jesus Christ and not to them. Are you aware that going to Church today, listening to the word of God, and in receiving the Eucharist, it is Jesus himself who has spoken to you and fed you at his table? Not every person will understand this, but you do. All this is because the secrets of the Kingdom of heaven are revealed to you. What many people treat with contempt is a pearl of great value to those who believe.
