HE MUST INCREASE AND I MUST DECREASE Jn 3:30

The Galilean wilderness is a hostile place to live. I remember some years ago going to the Holy Land, how the tour guide cautioned us not to step beyond the demarcated areas for fear of stepping on a landmine! It was in this wilderness where John son of Zechariah appeared, preaching the message of repentance. It was in this wilderness where Jesus travelled with his disciples preaching the good news of salvation.

This Sunday, the Gospel speaks about John the Baptist who identified Jesus as the "*Lamb of God that takes away the sins of the world*". In Hebrew tradition, lambs were sacrificed in expiation for sin. It was the blood of the lamb that was smeared on doors to save the Hebrews in Egypt. The lamb prefigured Jesus the innocent victim, the suffering servant who died to save mankind.

In John's gospel, John the Baptist prepares for Jesus and then steps aside. He had all the chances to be acclaimed the Messiah, indeed if he did so, everybody would have believed it. However the Baptist reminds us of our position in the building up of the Church and of our parish. We are called to be like John in the roles Jesus commissions us to play. While John was devoted in his call to be a prophet, he was also aware that, the outcome was not for his being recognised but for the recognition of Jesus as the promised saviour.

At one time some of the followers of John the Baptist who had now become followers of Jesus, came across a man who was preaching and performing great miracles using the name of Jesus although he was not one within Jesus circle. They immediately stopped him. When Jesus was told of this action, he was not impressed, instead he reminded the disciples to be quick in finding good in people who are unfamiliar. God has scattered seeds of goodness in all peoples cultures and languages. We should avoid the trap to think that there are superior people or cultures.

During this year 2026, let us outdo one another by looking out for parishioners who can be mentored to replace us in the ministries we are doing., I'm desperately interested to find young people who wish to become priests or to find parishioners who would like to become catechists. Yes, I'm looking for someone to prepare, so that he can take on the work I have laboured at for some years now. Let us have the joy to see people take on what we have laboured at for many years. They must increase and we must decrease (John 3:30).

COMMITMENT TO MY PARISH

For the last two weeks, I have dedicated this page to bring to your awareness the changing world which also affects the church. We know for example, that the cost of living affect the Church just like all other people. Whatever a parish needs for its upkeep, it has to be purchased from suppliers including the charges of the people who deliver it to the door. The Church being a Charitable organisation, goes an extra mile to respond to the needs of everyone in need without distinction. The good example I can give are Charities such as CAFOD or St. Vincent de Paul or Nuneaton Catholic Fellowship, they respond to the needs of every person irrespective of who they are or where they come from.

Over the past two weeks you have read about the financial needs and plans of our parish. The main point was to make us aware of the need '*to save for the rainy day*' as the saying goes. As we continue to face the challenges of the national cost of living, every parish and the Church in general, faces higher costs. But I'm confident in asking you to play your part, not because you are not doing so, but to make sure that we can continue to develop and to enhance the mission given to us by Christ.

While His Grace Bernard Longley is the spiritual father of the archdiocese, he is also the custodian of the material goods of the church in the archdiocese. He has made us aware that the physical needs of the church and the maintenance of its existing infrastructure are becoming too heavy to maintain. This is occasioned by falling numbers of practicing Catholics contrasted by the increasing number of the need to evangelise. He has asked all parishes to come up with plans that can reduce expenditure. This week you are being asked to consider prayerfully how you might support your parish especially to reduce expenditure or to find ways of creating income. Think about how you might support the parish, or about how you are playing your part, always keeping in your mind your means and circumstances.

A few weeks ago, I mentioned that contracting someone to cut grass in the parish grounds costs thousands of pounds every year, yet if just two or three people commit themselves to cut it once a month, it will save that money for our parish to spend it on other things. This is how to make money and how to spend it wisely.

On the weekend of 28th February and 1st March 2026, Coventry and Nuneaton Deanery will launch a diocesan appeal to the parishioners of this ecclesiastic area to consider increasing their giving to the parishes so that parishes may reduce cost or increase their production. Some of the ways of supporting the parish is by increasing the mandate on your standing order or by giving your Sunday collection through the Gift Aid Scheme. By doing so, the parish can claim 25% of the tax you pay to the government. This is a moment to dream big, to rethink our priorities—what we value, what we want, what we seek and to commit to act in our daily life on what we have dreamed of. Let us bring our talents to glorify God and his Church.

In a week or so, I will produce a form which you will be encouraged to take away and start to consider how you can support your parish.
