HOW DOES THE PARISH RUN?

Someone asked me recently how a parish, so vast as our own from A5 bordering Hinkley all the way to Fillongly operates. I told the person that Bishop Bernard Longley did not give Fr. Pius and I a manual to run a parish but that he was so convinced that the people of God who live within this ecclesiastical territory would cooperate with the priests he sent to them, to evangelise the area.

Our parish draws its continued existence on the generous sacrifices of volunteers, if it were not the people who respond to the needs of the parish, it would have closed its doors. The support you the people of God give, comes in different proportions and kinds. All of you work hard to put food on your children's table and to keep a roof over their heads and in addition you give financial support to the Church through Standing Order, Gift Aid or liquid cash. Some people support it by offering their time to come and do things. Doesn't it take time and real devotion for someone to come to choir practice, or to serve at the altar, or to practice the Readings or to clean the church? Don't you think that it requires parents more time to prepare children, and extra effort for the elderly to come to Mass? How nice to see Eucharistic Ministers visiting the sick with Holy Communion!

I'm so thankful to the parishioners who provide us with technical assistance without charge; here are some examples: improved lighting in the church at Our Lady's, the installation of the Projector and accessory television screen, the sorting out the sound system. All were provided free of charge by volunteers with technical knowledge. The Hymn and Mass books both at St. Anne's and at Our Lady's were bought by generous volunteers so that all of us might pray better. This is what makes our church survive.

I'm extremely pleased for many WhatsApp groups present in our parish; by these you communicate to one another by informing who will be where and when, so that the parish can run smoothly. It is very hard to describe how every parish priest feels when he notices his parishioners getting involved building the kingdom of God amongst themselves without feelings of self-importance. Now you have the answer to the question I was asked. The parish is alive because of the people who volunteer their time, expertise and money to support it. For all these Fr. Pius and I are very thankful.
