### **THEY TALK OF CHILDREN DO NOT FORGET THE OLD**

The culture of safeguarding has penetrated every sector of our society that I have a feeling that we are heading towards a society where abuse will be something of the past. Thanks to safeguarding policies enacted in all countries which aim at upholding the dignity of every person.

An African tradition, safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults is entrenched within the culture of the people, such that sometimes you read or watch in Western media stories that would be unthinkable. It is in the so-called third world societies where you are likely to find true care of children and vulnerable adults and respect for the elderly members of the society. African societies are communitarian. There is a saying in Africa that "*it takes a village to raise a child*" which means that whether a child belongs to you or not, he/she has to be taken care of, to be fed, dressed up and protected from danger. Children are seen as gifts from the ancestors and from God. They are the future of the clan. They discipline and protect every child, not just their own. Elders feel enthusiastic to pass on to the young, the skills they have laboured at for many years. Abuse of children by adults was considered shameful for the whole community.

The protection of vulnerable adults was of paramount importance. Old people, widows, orphans, people with disabilities were placed under the clan's care. In many cultures, land, food and housing were provided so that no old person would starve. Kicking or beating an old person was one of the worst taboos.

It is important to teach the young to respect old people, for the simple reason that whatever they enjoy today in their youth, was laboured at by the old people. Sadly, the old people are the most isolated members of our society and families. Pope Francis said that the quality of a civilization is judged by how it treats the elderly people and by the place it gives them in community life. Becoming old should be something to celebrate not to dread. Teach your children to respect your parents, so that their children may respect you when you get there.
