One said "*On 30th January, the Dean of Coventry and Nuneaton Mgr. Tom Farrell took away our Parish priest and installed him in another parish. We are upset about it; because we thought he was going to be our priest. Sharing him with another parish is upsetting, we are waiting for him to tell us whether he is tired of us*

I was impressed to come across members of my parish who are really passionate about it. I did not want to make myself known, otherwise the conversation would stop; however, I noticed that you are not silent, after the Sunday Mass many of you continue to talk about what you have celebrated.

The days of priests taking coffee and wine with their people are gone. They are now on the go. As practicing Catholics we are living at a difficult time, where it is no longer good to boast of private worship, private belief or concealed religious practice. Instead we are called to make our confession of Jesus Christ public, so that we become light to enlighten other people.

Sharing priests between our three communities (Our Lady of the Angels, St Anne and St. Joseph), is very good news, it reminds us of our duty to become evangelisers. The answer to the shortage of vocations is not in receiving foreign priests, but in encouraging your own children to become one. Fr. Pius and I have great interest in young people because we know that that is where the answer to our troubles lie.

Fr. Jimmy Lutwama AJ To Retire

What happens to the priest when he retires from active ministry? He is a man who leaves his parents at a young age to dedicate his life serving others. To the priest, every person is a brother or a sister, someone that he cannot give up on. Priestly work is exercised away from his natural family and because he is not always present to family occasions such as weddings, birthdays and funerals, his extended family members start to forget him!

Some years after his ordination, the priest will receive the news of the death of his parents. When they are gone, life changes totally for him; because none of his siblings, with their own troubles of life, will wish to add on the burden of taking care of their ageing priest relative, who by now will be in his midlife years. So what happens to the priest when he retires, or to be more exact what will happen to Fr. Jimmy when he retires?

Well, after many years of selfless work, a priest might move to a quieter setting like a parish residence or a retirement home for clergy. Since the Apostles of Jesus are a religious order, some members decided to start constructing a retirement house for their missionaries who are retiring from active ministry because of old age or poor health. The project is a twin building that will accommodate 18 priests who will be in need of care. It is here that Fr. Jimmy will retire after his ministry among us.

As you might have heard, Fr. Jimmy will turn 60 at the beginning of next month. He has expressed his wish that if anyone wishes to buy a card, flowers or any gift for that matter, the good gift would be to support the completion of the retirement house where he will spend the last days after his missionary work.

The Retirement home needs 55 doors at a cost of £80.00, and 39 windows at a cost of £66.00 each. Contribution to purchase of any of these will be very welcome than any booze or champagne .

As Fr. Jimmy turns 60, what he called his parental home no longer exist, thanks to his Order that it comes up with this project to ensure that priests, like him, will be taken care of in a community, until the Lord summons them one after another for their heavenly reward.

Building Bridges some parishioners from Our Lady of the Angels made a visit to Uganda to see where the Apostles of Jesus, the First Missionary Order of Priests and Religious were first established on the African Continent. They have made a collection of information which they wish to share with everyone in the Parish Hall at OLA on the following dates:
